The District Development Committee meeting for the month of December held today on the 23rd December, 2025 with an aim to review the progress of ongoing schemes and programmers of the different departments and to resolve the inter departmental issues. The meeting was chaired by Shri Parag Kumar Kakaty, ACS, District Commissioner, Darrang. At the very outset, the District Commissioner, Darrang welcomed all the members present at the meeting and initiated the discussion on the action points of the last DDC Meeting.

After threadbare discussion, the following decisions were taken at the meeting. The decisions of the meeting are as follows:
